## STUBAIER GLACIER

1.750 – 3.210 m

Austria's largest glacier ski area offers 26 modern lifts and 35 downhill runs with easy to demanding slopes and ski routes. The summit platform 'Top of Tyrol' at 3,210 m above sealevel is an outstanding must-see.

**Distance Innsbruck: 35 km | Slope kilometres: 64 | Lifts: 26**

## AXAMER LIZUM

1.580 – 2.340 m

The ski paradise Axamer Lizum extends over a high alpine winter landscape and is one of the most snow-sure winter sports areas in Austria. The so-called "white roof" of the Olympic region Innsbruck is an absolute "must-see" for all winter sports enthusiasts.

**Distance Innsbruck: 18 km | Slope kilometres: 41 | Lifts: 10**

## SKIZENTRUM SCHLICK 2000

1.000 – 2.240 m

The ski center Schlick 2000 in Fulpmes offers a wide variety of pure winter pleasure. Wide pistes in all levels of difficulty, a three-kilometre long, snow-covered descent down to the valley and a speed course with time measurement awaits you here.

**Distance Innsbruck: 12 km | Slope kilometres: 22 | Lifts: 11**

## KÜHTAI

2.020 – 2.520 m

At 2020 m Kühtai is Austria's highest situated village and offers, therefore, absolute snow guarantee. Kühtai is an unique experience also for the little ones with many snow activities.

**Distance Innsbruck: 37 km | Slope kilometres: 46 | Lifts: 1212**

## HOCHÖTZ

820 - 2.300

Sun-drenched, manageable and family-friendly: this is how the Hochoetz ski region is described very briefly. With 13 top modern cable cars and more than 64 sunny days, Hochoetz counts to the most family-friendly ski areas at the entrance of the Ötztal valley.

**Distance Innsbruck: 55 km | Slope kilometres: 39 | Lifts: 13**

950 – 1.800 m

The adventure mountain at the gates of Innsbruck of Innsbruck awaits you with 15 km of slopes, toboggan runs and its own kiddies park, modern infrastructure and an excellent gastronomy. Ideal for beginners and advanced skiers.
